1999년에 시작된 북부사무소는 시카고 외곽지역으로의 급격한 이민자 인구이동에 따른 다양한 복지 서비스 개발의 필요에 의해 노인복지, 가족지원, 이민, 건강, 문화교육 등 5개의 복지사업이 제공되고 있습니다. 계속 급증하는 레이크 카운티 지역 한인들을 위한 3번째 사무실의 서비스가 2013년 시작됨에 따라, 이제 한울은 시카고 전 지역에서 전문적인 통합복지사업을 수행하는 대표적인 비영리 봉사기관으로 성장했으며, 30년 역사를 교훈 삼아 한인 노인과 가족들의 삶의 질 향상을 위한 효율적이고 효과적인 복지관으로 한단계 도약할 것입니다.
